

Not so his nanghty brother Bill, Whose hands are ever working ill: He cut the rope of Davy's Boat, And off to Sea he let it float,







Maria here a pretty Maid, With humble hand and pliant voice, Calls heavinly Music to her aid, The subject of her carly choice.

Here Mary sits with anxious eye, Her Mother forth to market gone, Attentive to her sister's cry, And rocks the cradle all alone.




The Honse was left to Fanny's care. But more intent was she to eat. Than watching Carlo _____ slily there. Who broke the Eggs, and stole the meat.
